

## Children's Behavioral Health Services Fund (Jake's Law)

In 2020, the Arizona Legislature passed Jake's Law which funds behavioral health services for uninsured and underinsured children who are referred through a public educational institution.

Schools that meet the requirements of the law are able to refer students for behavioral health services, regardless of a student's Medicaid eligibility.



The Arizona School Board Association has created a <u>policy</u> for schools to use as a resource. Services can be provided by participating providers throughout the state who contract with the AHCCCS Complete Care-Regional Behavioral Health Agreements (ACC-RBHAs). AHCCCS registered providers not listed may be able to work with the ACC-RBHA in their area to become eligible for funding.
