

Bower Park Transitional Housing Facility

AHCCCS is excited to report construction is underway to establish the new Bower Park Transitional Housing Facility on the southwest corner of 24th Street & Van Buren in Phoenix. AHCCCS and ADOA have collaborated to build the new facility, which will provide transitional housing for 50 AHCCCS members with a Serious Mental Illness (SMI) designation who are experiencing, or at-risk of, homelessness. Residents will be allowed to live at Bower Park for up to two years. The facility is designed to support members with skill building to help them transition to traditional housing. Bower Park will be a pet-friendly environment where residents will be allowed to live with their pets.

An adjacent health care clinic is also being built, where AHCCCS members will be able to receive physical and behavioral health care. Copa Health will provide services at the facility after winning a competitive Request for Proposal. The building was designed by LEA Architects with a trauma-informed, gender inclusive approach with input from subject matter experts from AHCCCS, homeless shelters, and health care clinics. On-site construction oversight is led by ADOA and managed by Colton Construction. Funding for the facility is provided to AHCCCS by the Governor's Office and ADOA with funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), as well as State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF). The Bower Park Transitional Housing Facility is scheduled to open in the summer of 2025.
