

Treatment options are available even if you don't have health insurance coverage

If you have used substances like prescriptions, alcohol, marijuana, opiates/heroin, and all other illicit/synthetic drugs in the last 12 months or are currently actively using these substances, treatment options are available, even if you are underinsured or uninsured. For example, you can receive treatment even if you:

- Have no health insurance.
- Have health insurance, but it does not cover substance use treatment.
- Have applied for Medicaid benefits through the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS), and are waiting for approval.
- Have used substances while incarcerated or prior to incarceration.



This funding is available for:

- Pregnant women/teenagers who use drugs by injection,
- Pregnant women/teenagers who use substances,
- Other persons who use drugs by injection,
- Substance using women and teenagers with dependent children and their families, including females who are attempting to regain custody of their children, and
- All other individuals with a substance use disorder, regardless of gender or route of use, (as funding is available).

These services can include but are not limited to:

- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT).
- Residential Treatment.
- Case Management/Counseling.
- Transportation.
- Childcare.
- Other services supporting recovery.

Transportation and child care options can be arranged by the provider in order to help you access services.
