From October 1, 2023, to November 1, 2023, the population decreased 9,932 members, or less than 1%.

The major increase in the AHCCCS population from October 1, 2023, to November 1, 2023, was:

- 1,919 Transitional Medical Assistance (TMA)

The major decreases in the AHCCCS population from October 1, 2023, to November 1, 2023, were:

- 5,618 SOBRA Child
- 3,307 AHCCCS for Families & Children
- 1,278 Adult Expansion
- 1,052 SSI Related
